The roof of the ell is sheathed with slate. z S Dormers: Light has been admitted to the attic floor by means of several long shed dormers. ᆔ Porches: The building has a prominent entrance portico consist-ing of a colonnade of six (6) Doric columns with a partially C enclosed balcony at the second floor level, surmounted by a narrow wood entablature. The portico is accentuated by the _ front gable end which is framed by the cornice and eave mould-0 ings and has a wood fan light located at its apex. The portico Z extends out several feet from the front wall of the building. A S wooden porch is also located on the south side of the ell. Chimneys: The building has a total of four (4) interior chimneys, three (3) located on the north, and one (1) located on the south side. Cornice: A plain wooden cornice extends around the perimeter of the structure and is located under the eaves above the third story. Alterations: The exterior appearance of the Windsor House has changed very little with the exception of the addition of dormers, the subtraction of one (1) or two (2) chimneys, the enclosure of part of the second story front balcony, and the recent removal of many of the shutters.
