Describe present and historic physical appearance.

This 5 mile (8 km) long section of Rural Route 66 is used today as a local access road. The original asphalt pavement has deteriorated under heavy use and is now covered with cinder surfacing. Concrete box culverts date from the historic period. The cinder surfacing is occasionally spread beyond the edge of the original travelway, making it appear slightly wider than it originally was. This slight impact on the property's integrity is offset by the fact that the original cross-section template remains intact and by its retention of strong historic association.

This section of Route 66 closely followed an earlier 1920-21 alignment between Parks and Brannigan Park. Portions of the 1920-21 roadway can still be seen winding alongside the existing roadbed. At Brannigan Park, the earlier alignment was routed to the north. This property was constructed in two parts: Federal Aid Project 89E from Brannigan Park west in 1931 and FAP 24 east of Brannigan Park in 1932. The 24' wide travelway was paved by 1934. Avoiding rugged country to the south along the Santa Fe Railroad tracks, this section of Route 66 climbed 400 feet to the top of a saddle north of Fortynine Hill; at 7,400 feet above sea level it was the highest point on Route 66 in the country. Dropping into the open meadow of Brannigan Park, the traveler was greeted with a panoramic view of the San Francisco Peaks. The road continued east to the small town of Bellemont.

Route 66 followed this alignment until 1941, when new construction south along the railroad bypassed it. It was subsequently abandoned to Coconino County, which maintains it under an easement agreement with the Kaibab National Forest and private property owners. Today it is actively used as a local access road.


This section of Rural Route 66 is significant for its association with Historic US Route 66 in Arizona and the theme of transportation in Americal between ca. 1920 and 1944.

This part of Route 66 passes through a beautiful section of high mountain forest. Tourist facilities and private homes were located in Brannigan Park, a large well-watered meadow set against the spectacular backdrop of the San Francisco Peaks. Jensen's Log Cabin resort offered travelers a restaurant and "wayside service" and another development called Harwood's had a main lodge, filling station, lunch counter, and three guest cabins. Neither of these are open to the public today. Many travelers camped alongside the road on Kaibab National Forest land.

This section was known for the undisturbed beauty of the adjacent forest, and the roadside remains undeveloped today. Historic structures lining the road at Brannigan Park add to the historic setting.

The Brannigan Park section is an excellent example of Rural Route 66. The cross-section template from the historic period remains intact. A drive down this piece of old Route 66 imparts a strong feeling of its historic character to the traveler. It retains integrity of design, workmanship, location, feeling, association, and setting.




