The belfry contains coupled Romanesque arches. The tower is defined by corner pilasters terminating in stone capped piers. Similar two story brick city halls with a dominant corner tower were constructed in five Carver County communities after the turn-of-the-century. For various reasons, these city halls have been abandoned, demolished or altered to such an extent that they have lost their original design integrity. The Young America City Hall continues to serve the municipal functions assigned to it in 1909 and stands as a symbol of local civic pride.
