Young, A. M., House (Jessamine County M.R.A) (JS-7)

18. Description

Very well built and unaltered Federal house of the kind popular in Jessamine County--one story, central passage. Owned by an important local architect-builder.

One-story, five-bay, central passage Flemish bond brick house. Interior end chimneys, flat arches of gauged brick, pencilled joints. Has pegged window frames, nosed sills 9/6 sash; late Federal entrance with sidelights and flat topped transom, reeded trim and corner blocks. All joists are whole logs in main block and rear ell. Exterior cellar entrance on south end (rebuilt with block).

Rear ell (once separate, now connected by later shed roofed hyphen on old brick foundation) is two story, has original gambrel roof (uncommon) and pegged window and has a one-story room at the rear.

Interior of house has original mantels, presses and chair rail.

Changes are:

"Craftsman" style front porch replaces original gable roofed porch which spanned slightly projecting center bay.

Probably open rear porch converted to rooms and frame bathroom added behind it beside the ell.

Cornice replaced New metal shutters New roofing

Frame smokehouse is behind house.


North of house and included in boundary is a two-pen center passage log barn. Shed roofed additions span each long side and west end. The pens are 18' square, the passage 24'. Had wooden shingle roof, new metal.
