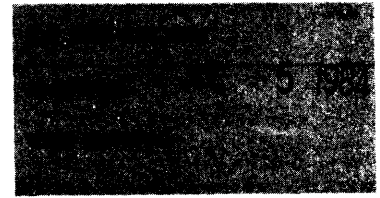

Description: The Boland House is an eclectic Queen Anne style house built in 1890. The house is sited on a hill overlooking the Cumberland River and historic site of Burnside. The house is a two-story frame structure with a weatherboard exterior. On the main facade of the house is a prominent elliptical bay and tower with a one-story porch. The porch features lattice work, carved porch posts, a spindled railing and attached bargeboard. Windows are one-over-one sash with attached shutters. On the first floor of the rounded bay is a tri-part window motif. In the gable fields are fish scale shingles and bargeboard. Below the eaves are exposed rafters. The original standing seam metal roof is present on the extended elliptical bay. The interior of the house has retained the original mantles and woodwork.

Significance: The Boland House is one of the most architecturally significant residences in Pulaski County. Constructed in 1890, the house is an interesting example of the Queen Anne style. The large elliptical bay, porch and bargeboard trim are all characteristics of the Queen Anne style and the house has not been significantly altered. The house was built by J. W. Boland who was a wealthy manufacturer of railroad ties. Boland constructed the house during Burnside's boom years and this row of houses along Lakeshore Drive was considered the elegant part of the community. In 1906 the house was purchased by Guy Fagaley who served two terms as mayor of Burnside. The Boland House reflects the height of Burnside's prosperity and it is both architecturally and historically significant.

Acreage: Approximately 1.2.

Verbal Boundary Description: The boundary of the Boland House is a rectangular town lot measuring approximately 180' X 300 feet. The boundary encompasses a non-contributing mobile home which is sited to the rear of the house and is not readily visible from the street facades.
