4. Owner: Tranquilino Vigil Jr., 1013 2nd, Las Vegas, N.M.

7. Description: Random ashlar, light brown sandstone foundation; shiplap with watertable, end boards, and string course treated like pilasters and entablature; decorative brickwork chimney; wood shingle roof; hexagonal shingles dormers and gambrel face; small enclosed overhangs with frieze boards; 1/1, lozenge/1 double-hung windows with board surrounds and moulding cornices, tripartite window group; single door with fan light; Ionic columns and spindle railing.

This wood frame house stands among later and modified houses, one-half block north of the Second Street Triangle and just east of the North New Town Residential District.

8. Significance: This house built about 1905 was occupied by Santa Fe Railroad conductor Lowery Clevenger in 1919. It is a virtually unaltered, finely detailed Colonial Revival building. It features a decorative chimney, gambrel roof, and classical elements including a three-part "Palladian" window group, "pilaster" end boards and porch columns which support an entablature which wraps around the house but is omitted under the porch itself.
