Built in 1755 for Geroge Tate (1700-1794), Mast Agent for the Royal Navy, the house is a tangible link with the pre-revolutionary New England trade in marine timber. Resentment over the British expropriation of the finest trees for H. M. Navy's masts and spars was a contributing cause of the Revolutionary War.

The outstanding architectural features of the George Tate House are the clerestory gambrel roof and the fine interior paneling. The clerestory gambrel form is one of only two known extant examples of this once fairly common northern New England type, the other being the much less splendid Burnham Tavern of 1770 in Machias, Maine. The austere, unpainted exterior of the Tate House belies the quite lavish interior trim and typifies the pioneer conditions under which the building was built. The Tate House is owned by the National Society of the Colonial Dames of America in Maine and is open to the public.
