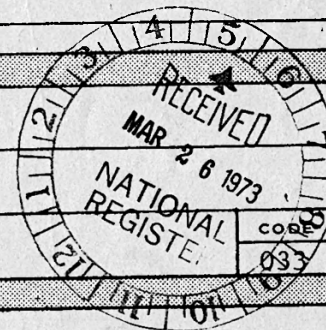

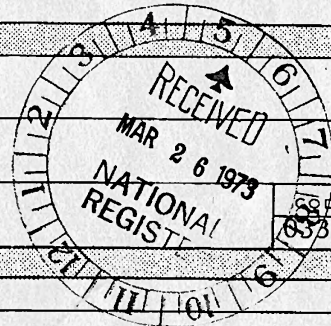

The barn was built in 1835 and today houses a display of old farm implements and buggies used by the Smith family.
