Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Gasthaus Alt Heidelberg is located near the southwest corner of Main and 11th Streets on Main Street, facing north. The building is in a commercial area at the east edge of downtown, composed of late 19th and early 20th century commercial buildings. The Gasthaus shares a wall with the building on the east side.

The original part of the building, Italianate in style, is rectangular in plan and measures 42 feet wide by 32 feet deep. The three story building has a five bay facade, a shed roof which slopes down toward the rear, and a brick-walled basement. It is of brick and wood construction. The brick is laid in common bond.

The entry, located in the central bay of the facade, is recessed. Above the opening on the facade is a sign reading, "Alt Heidelberg." There is another sign, extending perpendicularly from the facade above and on the east side of the entry which reads, "Gasthaus Alt Heidelberg." There are two large display windows, one on each side of the entry, with stone sills and lintels. These have vertical, horizontal and diagonal divisions, and replaced the four original double-hung windows. Windows on the upper floors are double-hung with one light in each sash, and have limestone sills and lintels.

The building has a wide wood entablature which includes a bracketed cornice. Under the cornice is a row of dentil-like brickwork.

Extending from the rear of the Gasthaus is a two-story brick addition with a basement. The roof is gabled. This addition is five bays (49 feet) deep. Window openings are segmental-arched. Window frames, which are not arched, have double-hung sash with one light in each sash. On the south side there is a door with a segmental-arched opening on each story. An open stair leads to the second story door.

Another rear addition of wood frame construction is one story high and has a shed roof.

The interior, which has been altered over the years, has a bar and restaurant on the first floor.

The original stairway from the main entrance to the third floor is in good condition. Two of the original hotel rooms, on the west side of the second floor, are in nearly original condition with a marble fireplace in each room.

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Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

Gasthaus Alt Heidelberg is historically significant as a European style tavern/inn, in continuous operation since its construction. The building is also a visual anchor to the east edge of downtown Lafayette.

The building was the Enterprise Hotel until 1909, when it became the American Hotel. It was later the Hotel Lafayette (1926) and the Derby Hotel (1939). In 1963, German-born Heinz and Margaret Steinborn bought the Derby Hotel and opened the Gasthaus Alt Heidelberg.

During the building's time as an active hotel, it did not compete with the prominence held, locally, by other hotels. The tavern was a low to middle-income gathering place for cards and drink. The hotel provided rooms on the second and third floors, with rest rooms down the hall. Some of these rooms are still intact, although they have not been used in many years. Few inns of this type can be found today, particularly with so much of the original fabric remaining.

The building is also important for its visual prominence. Located on a major one-way street into the downtown, the building is the first signal that one is entering a commercial area, since it is the first tall commercial structure following a residential area to the east. (See Photos 2 and 3.)

The restaurant has recently been refurbished, and specializes in German food and music. A beer garden has been created on the east side of the structure towards the rear.
