6 panel raised panel doors, have survived only on rear. Interior woodwork changed to Greek Revival; some evidence that house was raised to 2 stories, probably (if done) when interior trim changed. G.R. period also: 2 flanking 1 story 1 room wings with interior stone end chimneys.

South of the main house and defining a southern edge to the front "yard" is a stone outbuilding. Constructed of limestone with slightly more regular stonework on the west, front wall. 1 story with 2 exterior end chimneys; originally had 1 door on front and rear of each room, no windows. Doorway between the 2 rooms appears to be later; interior plastered; no evidence of stair although there are gable attic windows. Circular sawn sleepers; sawn attic joists whitewashed; sawn rafters - no collars. - C. Wells

This structure of 2 rooms, at different levels down the hillside, appears to have been built as a whole. The large hearths and floor plan would indicate that it was a kitchen/quarters. Very good masonry. - C. Woolley

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A at the end of Glenn's Branch Road, thence <sup>along road</sup> N 500 ft to B at a fence, thence E along fence 1000 ft to C, thence at right angle to fence 500 ft S to D, thence parallel to fence B-C 1000 ft to the beginning at the road, enclosing the hewn frame house and stone dependency and about 11 1/2 acres.
