DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Choate Building is located on 51 East Third Street, Winona, Minnesota. This department store was erected in 1881 for Mr. Hannibal Choate, a prominent early Winona merchant who originally started his merchantile business there in December 1861. Designed by A.E. Myhre, the building is a four story Romanesque Revival style structure measuring 80 feet by 140 feet. The exterior of the building is constructed of brick and stone with decorative terra cotta panels.

The Choate Building has retained its architectural integrity with the following exceptions -- a large tower on the west side was removed in the 1940s; the upper level was removed from the corner tower in the late 1950s; and a number of tin-roofed pinnacles were removed in the 1960s. All removals were due to extreme deterioration.

Although the first story windows on the west side were bricked-over in 1961-1962, the original windows are intact underneath the brick. The south side (rear) of the building was stuccoed in 1965 and at that time, the first story windows on that side were bricked over and the projecting fire escapes removed. The roof is of hot asphalt applications with asphalt composition shingles on gables and hips.

The interior is of frame construction and basically remains unchanged except for the occasional removal of partitions. The third and fourth floors remain unaltered and the rooms on the east side still contain original fireplaces with glazed tile hearths and mantles. The present owner plans to continue department store operations within the existing building with no major changes in the near future. The building is structurally sound but is in need of exterior cleaning.

#### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Choate Building was erected in 1881 for Mr. Hannibal Choate. He was called the "merchant prince of southeastern Minnesota" since his merchandising background and philosophy had an influence on the entire southeastern part of Minnesota.

Hannibal Choate came to Winona in 1861, and engaged immediately in the development of a growing and prosperous merchantile business. The present store at Third and Center was opened in the fall of 1889 with inventory valued at \$200,000.00.

Choate was a pioneer of the fixed-price system of merchandising. Before this system had been developed the customer bargained with the dealer as to how much an item would cost. Choate was also one of the first merchants to use extensive indoor displays on lines instead of keeping them on shelves. In addition, he established a wholesale business. By doing this he could supply other merchants of the community with the stock they needed.

Hannibal Choate was one of Winona's leading early citizens. He was widely respected for his merchandising and employment practices. He was the vicepresident of the Minnesota State Art Society, and president of the Winona Savings Bank and the Woodlawn Cemetery Association.
