Description

During the Railroad Era (1870-1914) in White County a variety of vernacular houses were constructed. They were also built out of a variety of materials. Surviving examples from this period, however, are somewhat limited. The James W. Edie House is a fine example of a two-story T-shaped building that is of frame construction clad with weatherboard. The gable roof is covered with composition shingles and the entire structure rests on stone piers.

Located just south of the intersection of Jackson and Washington Streets, this building was constructed less than two blocks southeast of Judsonia's commercial district. The James W. Edie House was constructed in 1883, and is in good condition. Its main, or west elevation is dominated by a two-story central bay. The second floor of the bay is fenestrated with a centrally placed pair of one-over-one double-hung wood sash windows; a pedimented lintel caps the window. A single centrally placed door enters the ground floor of the bay. It is flanked with three-pane sidelights, with kicks, and topped by a four-pane transom and pedimented lintel. A one-story hip roof porch covers this entrance. It is supported by wooden columns with capitals. Other decorative features include a jig-sawn balustrade and decorative wooden brackets.

The entire original structure is fenestrated with symmetrically placed two-over-two double-hung wood sash windows. A brick chimney rises from the apex of the gable on the eastern portion of the building. One-story shed roof porches originally extended along both the northern and southern portions of the house. The one on the northern side of the building is now screened in while the porch on the southern elevation has had its western half enclosed. The rest of this porch is still open and supported by simple wooden posts. Both porches are entered from the main building by two single wooden doors.

Significance

James W. Edie was one of the early settlers of Judsonia. He was born in Harrison County, Ohio on December 6, 1834, and moved to Judsonia in 1873. Prior to this he had lived in Buchanan County, Iowa. He operated a business in Judsonia that manufactured sash, doors and blinds. Edie was also a very prominent citizen of this community. He was the mayor for three terms, was Worshipful Master of Anchor Lodge No.384, of the Ancient Free and Accepted Masons as well as other fraternal organizations, and was on the board of directors of Judsonia University.

When this house was constructed in 1883, it was one of numerous T-shaped buildings built during the Railroad Era (1870-1914). Even though there are eighty-four of these buildings still left in the county very few exhibit the amount of integrity found in the James W. Edie House.

For the aforementioned reasons this building is being nominated under Criterion C with local significance.
