Describe THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE * Original unit unaltered. Additions were built on to original structure. The Monarch Steam Mills were built in 1879. The original building was a 40'x 50' stone and brick structure, having five floors, - a basement and four floors above grade. The building is of heavy timber construction and has been altered through the years on the interior by adding walls and doors in various locations. The first three floors above grade take on the Romanesque style of Architecture with the fourth floor being of French Mansar style, with the material skin of vertical ribbed copper or lead. A brick chimney stack exists to the west of the building about 100 ' tall. The cost of the original building was \$30,000.00 and would be classified in the Victorian period The Mill was sold in 1886 and additions were added presumably at that time. The additions were built to match the existing structure. A one story structure, 30' x 100' was added to the north approximately 50' x 120' in size a one story addition 50' x 100' was added to the west for equipment usage. The structures are in good sound shape and paving into the building is of brick pavers. The buildings exist on two and one-quarter acres of land. The original Newton Land Office occupies a position on this same piece of property. This structure, was prosumably built around 1871 and is approxi- mately 20' x 30' in size, being one story in height.
