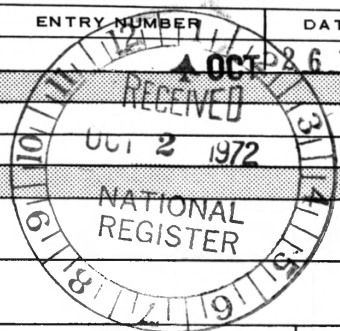

DESIGNED BY ARCHITECT RICHARD UPJOHN IN 1833 FOR ISAAC FARRAR A BANGOR LUMBER BARON. THE HOUSE WAS ERECTED IN 1843 IN A COMBINATION ENGLISH REGENCY AND GREEK REVIVAL STYLES. THE SYMPHONY HOUSE IS THE FIRST KNOWN AMERICAN COMMISSION OF ENGLISH ARCHITECT RICHARD UPJOHN.
