SUMMARY OF PRESENT AND ORIGINAL PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

3609 De La Reina is a two-story stucco over hollow tile Spanish Revival styled residence. The building is basically rectangular in plan with a one-story porch to the west. The hip on hip roof is barrel tile. Two stucco chimnies on the northwest wall have barrel tile caps and keyhole openings on each side. Windows are six over six double hung wood sash with stone sills. The deck over the porch has a brick and stone ballastrade. The chimney slope offsets two pairs of five-lite french doors. The doors have awnings and screed doors which allow access to the second story interior. There is a six-lite casement window with a lyre-shaped wrought iron railing cover on the chimney wall. The porch has seven bays of six-lite wood casement windows with top and side lites set in frames of segmental arches and divided by stone columns which have acanthus leaf capitals.

TEXT SUPPORTING SUMMARY OF PRESENT AND ORIGINAL PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

A terrace on the front (south) facade has a railing of pierced brick divided by stucco piers. Access to the terrace is from the entrance bay on the east. The one-story bay has two arched openings on the south and west. It has a moulded stone coping and a short railing of concrete capped pierced brick. Between the entrance bay and terrace is a Moorish arch. The south arch at the entrance has carved impost brackets. The spandrel above is outlined in red glazed tile infilled with orange glazed tile. The same glazed tiles alternate around the entrance door which is constructed of horizontal cypress planks. The window above the entrance bay has a wrought iron grille. Four pairs of wood five-lite casement windows overlook the terrace. They have triangular fixed lite transoms and the whole is framed by a single line of brick. The cornice line is composed of bricks with headers in a billetted pattern. The building is in excellent condition and is the most decorative of the original San Jose residences.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

3609 Via De La Reina is significant as one of 25 remaining structures built as part of the San Jose Estates subdivision, a planned, self-contained suburban community developed in 1925 by a group of Jacksonville businessmen as the height of the Florida Land Boom. As do the majority of the original San Jose structures, the building reflects the Spanish or Mediterranean Revival style of architecture developed for the subdivision by the Jackson-ville architects Marsh and Saxelbye. The building possesses sufficient architectual integrity and historic significance through association with the San Jose development to be individually eligible for nomination as part of the accompanying thematic nomination.

TEXT SUPPORTING SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

3609 Via De La Reina is one of 18 houses built in 1925 on lots owned by the builder of the San Jose development, O. P. Woodcock, with mortgage retained by the San Jose Estates Corporation. Public records state that, like each of the 18 houses, it was deeded to Woodcock in 1934 after several years of litigation involving Woodcock's company, the San Jose Estates, the Florida National Bank, and Charles Polochuck Company. Clear title was established after a suit brought by the Christopher Point Company. The house is larger and more ornate than the other residences with features such as a stencil marble living room floor, "Italianate" metal lighting fixtures and extensive use of decorative tile on the exterior. It may have been intended for a particular owner or as a "Show House". Woodcock sold this house to Mr. and Mts. Norris in 1944. The Norris's divorced in 1961 and after some litigation the house was sold to Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Harrison who modernized the mechanical systems and the kitchen and bath. The house was recently purchased by William and Mallory Cooper who previously lived in another original San Jose Estates residence on San Jose Boulevard.
