

This house is significant for its architecture and its association with the exploration and settlement of the Bergen County, New Jersey area. It is a reasonably well preserved example of the Form/Plan Type as shown and more fully described herein. As such, it is included in the Thematic Nomination to the National Register of Historic Places for the Early

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Stone Houses of Bergen County, New Jersey.

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The Bartholf family operated at least one mill, before the Revolution, near Darlington Avenue; this may account for the early use of sam timber in the construction of the house. - GKL
