18. Description
 This firehouse is a two-story brick structure. The first floor has a large multi-paned, over-head fire door with a simple stone lintel. The upper floor has five double-hung windows contained in a stone surround and articulated by four doric engaged columns. The building has a hip roof with overhanging eaves and is pierced by a dormers.

19. History
 This structure was built in 1907 to serve the developing Crescent Hill neighborhood.

20. Significance
 This structure is a restrained example of classical revival motifs applied to a small-scale public building. Its scale and style is reflective of the commercial and residential structures in the area. The building was designed by the architectural firm of Thomas and Bohne. The tower
