He conducted a general merchandise establishment in Munfordville, and in the early days was president of the old Louisville and Nashville Turnpike Company, which maintained an excellent road between the two cities.... He was known as one of the able physicians and surgeons of the state, as a progressive and reliable business man, and as one whose integrity and honor were beyond cavil" (E. Polk, <u>A History of Kentucky and Kentuckians</u>, vol.___p.661).

The building, little changed since its construction, is one of the few surviving early 19th century brick structures remaining in Munford-ville and Hart County.
