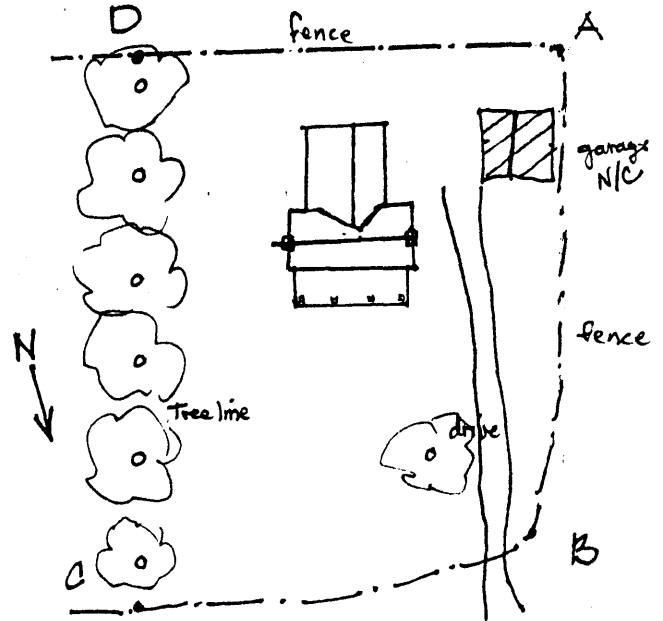

44. Site Plan (and boundary description and justification for N.R. sites):

Beginning at A where the fences intersect, N 150' along a fence to B, E 90' along a fence line and crossing the drive to C, S 150' along a treeline to D, W 90' along a fence line to the point of origin. The nominated acreage includes the house and a modern, non-contributing frame garage and separates the domestic space from the modern dairy farm complex.

Point A is at the intersection of the fences defining the southern and eastern edges of the yard and is 20 feet south of the southwestern corner of the garage.

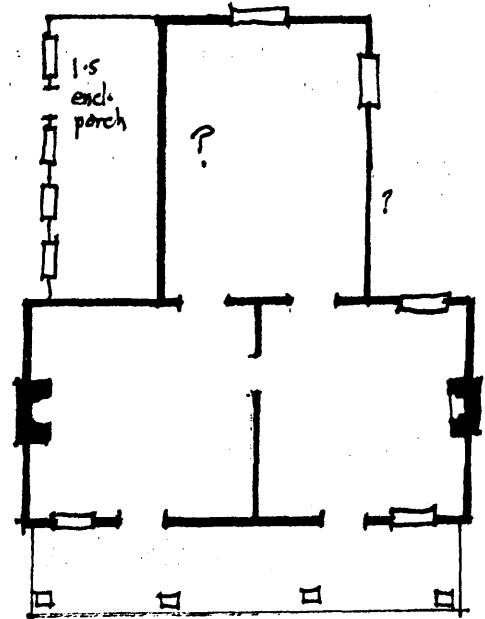

45. Description and House Plan:

Exterior

1-story, 4-bay, 5-course common bond brick hall-parlor (two-room) plan with a later 19th c. rear ell with enclosed side porch (now covered with vinyl siding), ashlar stone foundation, partially exterior end chimneys, original box cornice and tapered rake boards, front doors replaced, windows altered to 2/2 (6/9 sash remains in rear wall and in east end wall), 20th century porch added.



13. Statement of Significance: (continued)

in Shelby County. The ell effectively demonstrates how houses were enlarged over time. and extends the house's period of significance into the periods up to 1900.

45. Description and House Plan: (continued)

Interior:

Enclosed corner stair in southwest corner of east room, square corner blocks at interior doors and windows and at cupboards flanking fireplaces in both rooms, mantels similar in both rooms; molded architrave with shelf on tapering octagonal columns, low beaded baseboard in east room, high molded baseboard in west room, frame ell on concrete block foundation with enclosed porch on east side.

Outbuildings:

A modern, non-contributing garage is included within the boundaries.

The boundaries enclose one contributing and non-contributing building.
