The Whitehouse Block is three stories high and constructed of brick with stone and metal trim. Italianate style features include an over-hanging cornice, decorative metal window caps and stone quoins for the second and third stories. The storefront has been extensively altered with plate glass and only two cast iron piers, which are shared with adjoining stores, survive.. The windows are one over one double hung sash.
