DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Machias Public Library, designed by George A. Clough of Boston, is a fine example of the Romanesque Revival style in a small public building. The one and a half story Library is of granite ashlar construction with a slate shingled gable roof and a T-shaped plan.

The main facade faces north and is dominated in its center by a porch with a large semi-circular arched entryway. To the left of this porch, in the gable end of the "cross" of the "T", is a row of five one-over-one windows surmounted by semi-circular arches which, with their arcade effect, reflect the arched porch entry. In the half story is a pair of much smaller one-over-one windows, similarly arched. To the right of the entrance porch, on the "stem" of the "T", is a series of three four-over-four double-hung sashed windows closely spaced to each other. Unlike the other windows mentioned above, these have plain granite lintels, and are not arched.

The west end of the building has an identical series of simple four-over-four windows, while the east end, which is vertically divided by an external stone chimney, has a single four-over-four window on each side of this chimney.

A Romanesque style pinnacle of carved stone sits atop each of the three gable ends.

Clough has here created a dignified building which avoids austerity through its asymmetry and refined detailing. Machias is fortunate to have such a structure as its public library.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The importance of the Porter Memorial Library in Machias is two fold. The first significant aspect is the architecture and granite construction of the huilding itself. The Library is equally important as an illustration of the civic action by the Machias Library Association and the benevolence of the Porter family.

During his successful railroad career, Henry Homes Porter sent \$1500 to the Machias Library Association which was in the insecure position of having a permanent book collection and only a temporary home. He instructed the Association to draw up plans for a library huilding, and offered \$9,000 more to construct the library. In 1891 plans were completed public lot which had been the site of a Soldier's Monument was chosen as the location. The library was dedicated on September 15, 1893 and opened for husiness on December 6th of the same year. The Library Association named the building Porter Memorial Library to honor both H.H. Porter, and his father, Rufus K. Porter, who had ween as respected attorney in Machias for many years and had founded the library ca. 1815.

Henry Homes Porter was born in Machias in 1835. He attended school at Washing ton Academy until age 15 or 16. In 1853, after working in Eastport for a few years, he headed west and began to work for the Galena & Chicago Union Railroad. In 1860, he switched to the Michigan Southern and Northern Indiana Railroad, and became superintendent there in 1862. He left in 1865 to become a director of the First National Bank of Chicago and an investor in lumber and stockyards. A director for the Chicago and Rock Island Railroad, Chicago and Northwestern Railroad, and Union Pacific Railroad. At various times, Porter invested his own money directly into the industry in 1874 with the purchase of the 190 mile West Wisconsin Railroad. Unable to sell it to his Northwestern directors, Porter bought other railroads at depression prices to form the 1300-mile Chicago, St. Paul, Minneapolis & Omaha system. He was able to sell this system to Northwestern for a large price in 1882. Porter later became president of Chicago and Eastern Illinois Railroad, then retired from railroad management in 1902. He died in Chicago in 1910.

This staunch little Romanesque Revival library stands not only as a monument to community striving for cultural improvement but also to the unusual financial opportunities open to ambitious and clever men as the Industrial Revolution exploded in the last third of the 19th century.
