Estemmed Friends yours of the
19th came duly to hand. The
bill of damages done to the Flour
by Capt Sharmen I have settled
with him. say \$7.25/100 & passed to
your credit. that of Ruscoss I
have made out according to your
Statement but have not yet settle
it with him he complains very
much at the bill and says he will
write you concerning it.

I have about 20 Bbls flour to send to
you which I have not had an opportunity
to send. New Wheat is now selling for 6^{cts}
at which Price I have bot upwards of
400 Bus I wish you to Inform me by
what line of Boats I shall send it to.
you. if you wish I will see Capt Phelps
or some one belonging to that line and
send it by them. I think there will not
be much wheat to market this Fall as
our harvest was very late. our harvest
was got in in good order. some of
the wheat ~~has~~ ^{is} shrunk.

Wheat continuing to come in in small quantities
probably I shall have 500-600 Bus in ten days!
