NAME: Simmons House ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: STREET NO: 489 Prewitt Street Situated on a residential corner lot facing east, this building is a one-story, irregularly massed, turn-of-the-century frame residence. Hipped TOWN/VIC: Magnolia roof has irregularly introduced pedimented gables and a chamfer-cornered COUNTY: Pike three-bay six-over-six-windowed pavilion on southwest corner. Main entrance consists of paired doors with upper oval glass inserts and transom. BLOCK/LOT: 29 One floor-to-ceiling window, two-over-one, completes fenestration in the Rex Simmons PRESENT OWNER: main facade. The secondary (northern) facade has one floor-to-ceiling 489 Prewitt Street ADDRESS window, two-over-one, and a single-door entrance. A porch supported by Magnolia, Mississippi 39652 slender columns with Ionic capitals curves around both facades. Two PRESENT USE: Residence interior chimneys. NATIONAL PHOTOS STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE: The Simmons House is an architecturally significant building within the context of Magnolia's extant historic resources. The building is valuable as an example of a vernacular architectural type used in turn-of-the-century Magnolia. Its massing is similar to the Lanier House (400 North Clark) and it features Colonial Revival-inspired columns with Ionic capitals, a trait unusual in Magnolia.
