Olallie Lake Guard Station

Guard Station: Detached office with living quarters; rectangular plan, 1 story, poured concrete foundation, nailed-wood frame, medium hipped gable roof, small center gable does not extend beyond eaves trim; rubble masonry exterior end chimney on right side elevation. Exterior walls are clad with semi-lunate shiplap to four-foot level, vertical board and batten to eaves and on gable ends. Windows are four and eight-light single sash in vertical placement, all flanked by decorative vertical board shutters with single complex tree symbol excised from center. Main entry, centered on west-facing facade, is single-leaf door surfaced with boards in chevron pattern; single step hewn from a section of peeled log. No obvious structural or material alterations to exterior.

Garage/Storage: Detached single vehicle storage; rectangular, 1 story, poured concrete foundation, nailed-wood frame, wood-shingled medium gable roof. Exterior walls are clad with vertical board and batten. No windows. No decoration.

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The Olallie Lake Guard Station typifies the construction projects undertaken by the Civilian Conservation Corps and signifies the aid to the local community provided by the emergency work-relief program through employment of youth and experienced craftsmen, purchase of building materials and camp supplies, and personal expenditures of enrollees. The property represents the Forest Service's presence in the locality, as the headquarters for field operation, and denotes, via the physical facilities required to carry out the agency's expanding responsibilities, the critical transition in the Service's development from custodial superintendence to extensive resource management. The Olallie Lake Guard Station exemplifies the rustic architectural idiom developed by the Forest Service, Pacific Northwest Region, to impart Forest Service identity and to represent its purposes and ideals, and signifies the agency's particular interpretation of a singular expression of early twentieth century American architectural thought. Possessing very high qualities of design and execution, the Guard Station is a very good example of an architectural locution invested with special aesthetic and associative values by the agency that created it.

Olallie Lake Guard Station:

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From the Bench Mark designated S 355 ( a standard disk stamped "S 355 1942") about 0.4 mile southwest along the Breitenbush road from Olallie Lake Guard Station, Jefferson County, about 0.3 mile northeast of a sign "Olallie Lake," about 100 feet west of the west edge of Olallie Lake, near the east end of a corrugated-iron pipe culvert, 35 feet east of the center line of the road, in the top of a rock, and about level with the road, as described in the records of the United States Coast and Geodetic Survey; thence north 29° east 2,100 feet to the junction of Forest Service roads #4220 and #170 (all bearings and distances are calculated and subject to adjustment in actual field location); thence south 29° east 150 feet; thence north 0° west 200 feet; thence north 0° east 200 feet; thence north 0° east 200 feet; thence south 0° east 200 feet to close on the northeast corner of the property. The site boundaries are delineated so as to include the Olallie Lake Guard Station; area of the property is 0.92 acre, more or less.
