Boundary: The streets on the north and east sides of the building and 20 feet from the building on the other two sides.

DESCRIPTION:

Style: Neo-Classical

This Doric tetrastyle structure has a projecting two story portico with entablature and heavy cornice. A small domed clock tower rises from the center of the building. Rectangular windows are used throughout except in the courtroom where round arched windows are employed.

The entry and courtroom have pressed metal ceilings. The courtroom and balcony ceiling is coved and has large recessed squares overhead. Pilasters atop painted panel wainscoting surround the courtroom. The egg and dart motif is used in the cornice. There is a skylight in the center of the room directly under the clock tower which has frosted glass panels, muting the sunlight that shines into the room.
