School #24 is a one-story frame, rectangular plan, single bay, building constructed ca. 1895. The school was constructed in a gable front plan with one large room on the interior. The school has a brick foundation, gable roof of metal standing seam, and exterior of weatherboard siding. On the main (east) facade is the main entrance which retains an original four panel door and two light transom. On the north and south facades are three bays with each bay containing an original four-over-four rectangular wood sash window. The door and windows have simple frame cornices. The school has an interior brick flue.

The interior of the school is composed of one large room with a raised platform and blackboards located at the west wall. The only other significant interior feature is tongue-in-groove wainscoting.

The school is sited on a large rural lot just to the west of the McCubbin-Harned Road. There are no adjacent site features.

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PROPERTY TYPE: Educational Buildings

School #24 is significant under criterion A for its association with the county public school system of the late 19th century. The school is one of several dozen frame buildings which were constructed during this period to accommodate county school children. The building has not been altered and retains its original design and detailing.

After the 1880s, the county's school board began to replace earlier schools with modern structures and to construct new buildings across the county. Over the next several decades over thirty new one-room schools were built in the county and were the centers of public education for a number of years. School #24 was one of these and was built to serve students in this section of the county. The school was occupied until the 1950s when consolidation of the school system occurred at which time it was vacated and sold. The building is presently used for storage but retains its original appearance. The school is one of the best preserved examples of a rural schoolhouse from the turn of the century.


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
Verbal Boundary Description: The boundary for School #24 is shown as part of lot 14, on Larue County tax map # 24. The boundary is a rectangle measuring 50' by 100' with the southeast corner located ten feet from the southeast foundation of the school and the northwest corner located ten feet from the northwest foundation of the school.

Boundary Justification: The boundary for School #24 includes all property historically associated with the school.
