VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A, a point 0 ft diagonally SW from the corner of the stone house, thence parallel to walls of house and at right angles 150 ft N to B, 200 ft E to C, 150 ft S to D, and 200 ft N to the beginning, containing the stone quarters - about 7/10 acre.
