DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The main dwelling on Felt's Farm is a beautiful example of a pre-classical "I" two story Pennsylvania type house. The common bound brick structure is rectangular in plan with an off center single story rear wing that houses the kitchen. A fieldstone foundation supports the masonry load bearing walls. The front, four bayed facade has two doors centered on the first floor faithfully completing the mirror image of the design. Two centered interior chimneys at each end of the main structure and one at the end of the rear wing provide the home's heating. The medium pitched gable roof is now sheathed with asphalt shingles and is accented by a plain wooden cornice with end returns. All openings are rectangular with rock faced lintels and lugsills. The windows are single glazed, double hung with simple wood surrounds. Two quarter round windows accent either side of the chimney above the cornice line in the gable ends.

The house is structurally sound although some of the brickwork especially on the chimney stacks is in disrepair. Additions since the house's construction have been removed, plaster on one of the exterior walls remains as a result.

The five roomed interior has much of the original woodwork all of unpainted walnut. No modern kitchen or bathroom has been included in the original structure. With the exception of minimal changes, the house remains in near original conditon.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Felt's Farm is a fine example of a Federal Style house.

In 1831, Francis Harris, an early owner of the property built a mill nearby which "became the nucleus around which the present city of Eaton gradually expanded." Later a grist and saw mill were constructed on the same site by later owners. One of the owners, George W. Carter and an associate, W.W. Worthington were drilling in 1884 to see if any coal existed in the area. They accidentally tapped a gas well and the "stench and roar" of the escaping gas caused the men to fear they had "encroached on the territory of his satanic majesty." Two years later, better informed, the pair bought in the first gas well in Indiana.

The Felt Farm has an interesting architectural modification which relates to its setting. The gable end of the house facing the river has two windows in each floor to take advantage of the view, while the other gable end remains blind.

The history of its owners, rich in local color, coupled with the house's definite architectural merit gives Felt's Farm true significance.

Faithfully constructed in the Pre-classic "I" style, the date of completion is not know, although the best estimate would be the late 1820's.
