## 45. Description and House Plan: This 12-story, brick and stone house,

which faces east, features picturesque massing and numerous references to English vernacular architecture, including walls that blend brick and stone in an irregular fashion, halftimbered gables, sloped gable-peaks, a roof covering in four colors of irregularly cut slate, leaded diamond-shaped panes, iron strap hinges, and medieval-style lighting fixtures. The only pronounced 20th century features are the metal casement windows. Two of the windows have cove canopies of copper. The dormers are variously hipped, gabled or shed-roofed. The garage, a steeply hip-roofed block to the rear, is connected to the house by a covered walkway enclosed on the north side. The suggestion of a service court in the angle formed by the garage and the rear of the house is created by three curved walls extending from corners of the building, by the axes of driveway and concrete sidewalks and by a rustic gate. 

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
