DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Octagon Cottage was originally part of a summer resort complex known as Brightwood Beach located on the south shore of Litchfield's Lake Ripley in Meeker County. Situated on the sloping shore, the cottage is one of fourteen properties out of a total forty-seven original lots with direct access to the lake.

Built in 1889 the cottage is constructed on an octagonal plan. The central core of the cottage is two storeys. A total peripheral, octagonal porch surrounded the cottage. In 1907 a third of the screened porch was enclosed and a rectangular porch was added to the (rear) south side. The exterior treatment of the cottage is vertical pine board and batton siding. The octagonal, conical roof retains its original shingles.

The interior of the cottage is also furnished in pine, having pine flooring and exposed, unfinished pine rafters in the first and second floor ceilings. The interior has retained its integrity with the exception of added carpeting and some paneling. The original floor plan called for an open living, kitchen and dining room on the first floor and one bedroom on the second floor. The 1907 addition created an additional bedroom, a separate kitchen and modern plumbing facilities.

A stairway leads from the house to the lake shore. Situated on the lot is a concrete block boat shed and an outdoor privy.

#### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Octagon Cottage is an example of the type of building recommended by Orson Fowler in his publication, A Home For All or the Gravel Wall and Octagonal Mode of Building, a popular but short lived mode of architecture popular in the 1850s. It is the only surviving octagonal cottage thus far recorded in the The structure is in a good state of preservation and apart from a 1907 state. kitchen/porch addition, retains a significant amount of architectural design integrity.

The cottage was, during the years 1889-1894, part of a planned resort community constructed on the south shore of Lake Ripley. The resort was the idea of two Litchfield promoters, Hiram Branham and Charles Greenleaf. The partners purchased nearly the whole south shore of Lake Ripley in 1888 and by May of 1889 with the assistance of Litchfield architect, G.B. Phelps, more than a dozen cottages and a two storey hotel were ready for July occupancy.

Advertising brought vacationeers from the Eastern states, St. Louis, Chicago and Florida, and for the next four summers, Brightwood was the showplace of activity. Musicals, recitals, tennis tournaments, steamboat excursions, reunions and conventions were held at Brightwood; its hotel, rental cottages and recreational hall providing ample guest facilities.

When financial difficulties struck Messrs. Branham and Greenleaf, a stock company composed of 86 Litchfield businessmen put up the necessary capital to purchase the resort. However in June of 1894, the resort furnishings were auctioned off and the resort cottages not privately owned were sold. Some cottages were moved to Litchfield, or like the hotel and recreational hall were dismantled and used in other construction.

Of the dozen or more buildings that comprised Brightwood Beach only two cottages are left. Because of extensive alterations to one, only the octagonal cottage remains to reflect the style and quality of recreational living experienced at Brightwood Beach in the 1890s. Its significance lies in its relatively unaltered condition, its good state of preservation and in the 1889 adaption of an octagonal house design by a local architect to that of a summer cottage.
