Stallings moved to Birmingham and sold the house to A. Graham Stewart, who owned a drug store on East Commerce Street. Several years after Mr. Stewart's death his widow married Judge L. M. Lane who owned the house next door. After Judge Lane's death Mrs. Lane sold the house to his grand-daughter, Mrs. Dan Sherling.
