



Stabled in Burlington, Colorado, aboard the historic Kit Carson County Carousel, this stately wooden armored horse is one of a total menagerie of 46. The 85-year-old, hand-carved carousel is a National Landmark and has been fully restored to its original splendor. It operates regularly during the summer months, but special tours are available year round upon written request to P.O. Box 28, Stratton, Colorado 80836



This "ferocious" tiger and 45 wooden friends are aboard the Kit Carson County Carousel at Burlington, Colorado. Now a National Landmark, the carousel was carved in 1905. The animals, a Wurlitzer Monster Military Band Organ and 45 oil paintings are fully restored to their turn-of-the-century splendor. The Carousel operates during the summer months.

Now a National Landmark, the carousel was carved by the Philadelphia Toboggan Company in 1905. The animals, oil paintings and band organ are fully restored. The Kit Carson County Carousel's Hippocampus (sea horse) is now featured in a spectacular 18x24 vertical poster in six colors.

The carousel is a national landmark located on the fairgrounds in Burlington, CO, and was carved by the Philadelphia Toboggan Company in 1905. It has been fully restored to its original splendor and operates daily during the summer months.
