The William Simonds House possesses integrity of location, design, setting, materials 2010 A22AM (partial), workmanship, feeling and associations. It is significant as a fine academic 08 BOSTON, example of the Mansard style featuring a symmetrical three bay facade, a bell-cast mansard roof with patterned slate, projecting eaves resting on elaborate paired brackets, lavish use of wooden ornamentation, and polygonal bays flanking the entry. It also reflects the continuing development of South Main Street as a fashionable residential area. It meets criteria A and C of the National Register of Historic Places.

The Simmonds House is a two story wood-frame structure enclosed by a bellcast mansard roof of patterned slate. It displays a symmetrical three bay facade and lavish architectonic ornamentation. Centered on the facade is a glazed, double-leaf entry with simple surround; the entry is flanked by polygonal bays linked by a one story porch, all featuring brackets and other detail. At the second story, narrow paired windows occupy the central bay while standard windows occupy the outer bays; all are headed by pediments. This fenestration is repeated in the dormers above. Other trim includes corner pilasters and elaborate paired brackets at the overhanging roofline. The only alteration to the house is the recent application of vinyl siding which was fortunately achieved without removal of any of the fine wooden trim.

This house was built in 1877 by William and Mary R. Simonds on land owned by Harrisonic generation Parker. At the death of Mary Simonds in 1915, it was left to Cora Simonds Morgan, their soloni daughter, and her husband Benjamin who occupied it until 1954, creating a long history of family ownership. Before Cora Simonds was married, she ran a millinary shop in this house. Cora Morgan married Ben Morgan who was employed by the George Blanchard Lumber Yard until he died. William Simonds also had two sons, Henry R, Simonds and William B. Simonds. The former ran a provision store on Main Street, while the latter ran a fruit and vegatable wagon in the 1890s before moving to Hollis, N.H. where he bought a farm in 1907. The house reflects the continuing development of southern Main Street as a fashionable residential area in the 19th century.
