(photo 1) by single stone slab. Pair of wooden doors in center of W. end added. Opening cut in S side for vehicle entrance. (photo 2)

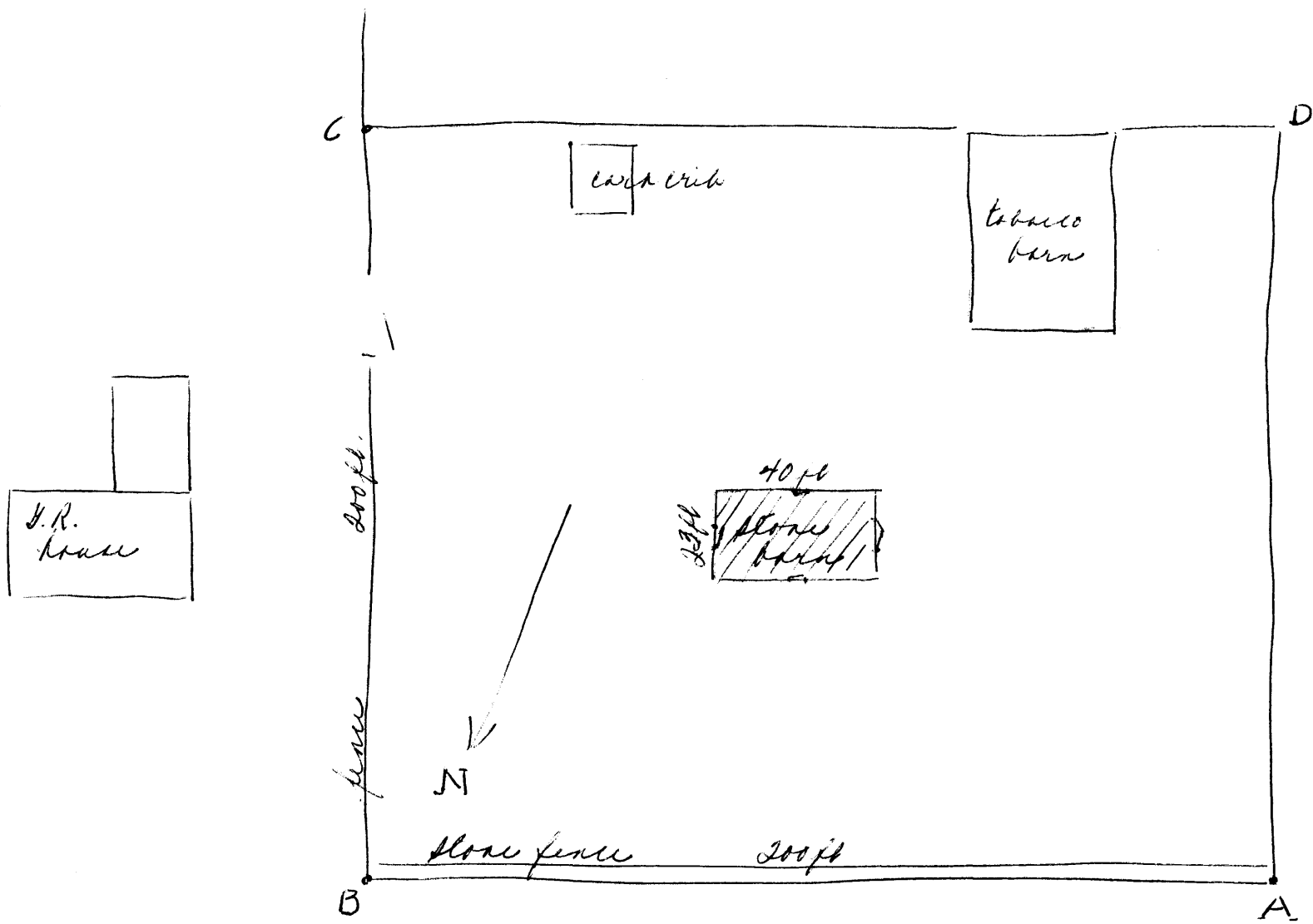
Mortar nearly totally gone, some cement pointing in W. end; walls filled with clay. Inside walls raw. No chimney.

Roof structure later: 2x4 rafters battled at ridge, some circular sawn cellar beams nailed on.

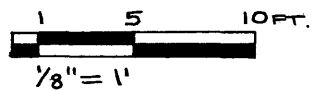
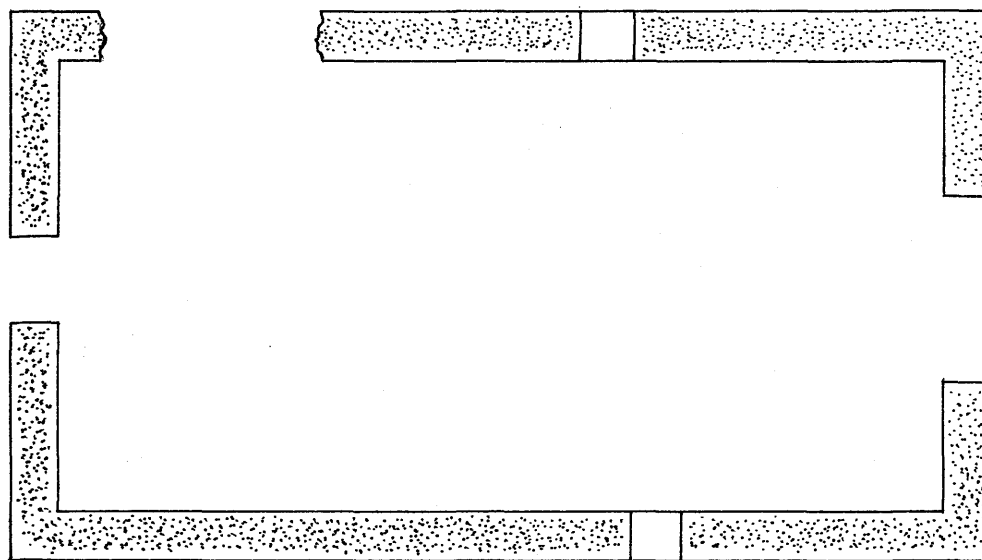
VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A, the fence corner NW of the stone barn at the road, thence with stone fence and road E 200ft to B, thence with fence around barn yard S 200ft to C, W 200ft to D, and N 200ft to the beginning, containing the stone barn, a corn crib and tobacco barn - about 9/10 acre.
