The nominated property consists of a rectangle, 20 feet wide by 85 feet long, whose vertices coincide with the outside corners of the bridge abutments at each end of the bridge, and includes only the bridge superstructure and substructure.

Because the bridge is located on a public road, there are no legal boundary lines for the ends of the bridge. Therefore, these boundaries are drawn to encompass only the superstructure and substructure of the bridge itself.

Situated about 7 miles north of Elk Point in central Union County, Bridge No. 64-061-199 carries an unpaved road across Brule Creek. Resting on wood-pile abutments with plank back walls and wing walls, the 80-foot single-span superstructure is a pin-connected, 5-panel, Pratt through truss with angle-section railings. The truss web has the following configuration: the upper chords consist of back-to-back channel sections riveted to a continuous cover plate and V-lacing; the verticals consist of back-to-back channel sections riveted together on both sides with V-lacing; the diagonals and lower chords consist of paired, rectangular-section eyebars; the counters are cylindrical eyerods with turnbuckles. Suspended by U-bolts from the lower-chord pin connections, the rolled I-beam floor beams carry wood stringers and deck. Portal bracing and overhead struts consist of back-to-back angle sections. Top-lateral and bottom-lateral bracing consists of cross-braced cylindrical eyerods. The top-lateral bracing is intact only in the center panel. Otherwise, the bridge's integrity is good.

Bridge no. 64-061-199 is being nominated to the National Register of Historic Places as part of the "Historic Bridges in South Dakota" Multiple Property Nomination. It is related to the historic context of "Historic Bridges in South Dakota, 1893-1943" and is classified with the associated property type for iron and steel frame bridges. This bridge is individually eligible for the National Register under Criterion A as a representative example of important patterns of bridge construction in South Dakota during the 1890s and through the first two decades of the 20th century, in which a different out-of-state bridge builder tended to dominate bridge construction in each county. This bridge is also eligible under Criterion C as the only surviving bridge in Union County built by the Western Bridge and Construction Company, a long-term county bridge builder. The bridge retains good integrity.

Around the turn of the 20th century, the homesteading boom west of the Missouri River coupled with the expanded agri-business east of the river led to an increased demand for reliable bridges in South Dakota. Accompanying the increase in bridge construction was the emergence of a pattern of business wherein almost every county in the state seemed to be dominated by a different bridge builder. This pattern began to be evident in the late-19th century. It grew even stronger after the turn of the century when the counties began turning to the system of awarding annual contracts for bridge work. Most typically, the counties awarded annual contracts to the same firm year after year. This relationship between the counties and the bridge firms was probably due to "pooling," an illegal but common practice across the country at this time. Under pooling arrangements, various bridge-building firms agreed to divide states among themselves, assigning particular counties to specific firms. Most such firms operating in South Dakota at this time were based out-of-state. This pattern of business remained strong in South Dakota until about 1920 when the State Highway Commission strengthened its control over bridge construction practices in the counties

The Western Bridge and Construction company was one of several important Omaha based contractors operating in South Dakota. John W. Towle of Omaha organized the firm in about 1907. A native of Nebraska, Towle received his education in civil engineering at Cornell University and returned to his home state, where he worked in the late 1890s as the general western agent for the Canton Bridge Company. Just after the turn of the 20th century, he started his own bridge-building company, which by

1907 was known as the Western Bridge and Construction Company. The Western Bridge Company held the Union County bridge building contract from 1908 through 1921.

Bridge No. 64-061-199 is the only representative example of a bridge constructed by this long-term county bridge builder, surviving in Union County. According to the builder's plates on the northwest and southeast end posts, Bridge No. 64-061-199 was erected by the Western Bridge and Construction Company of Omaha. Although the plaques are undated, the Union County Commissioners Records indicate that Western Bridge was the successful bidder on the county's annual bridge-building contract from 1908 to 1921. The bridge's design and construction is consistent with this period.
