The Krause Farmstead is located in rural Dover Township near the intersection of County State Aid Highway 10 and Interstate 90, about one-half mile south of the community of Dover. The farmstead area is confined to a five acre area and includes the house, barn, and three miscellaneous outbuildings.

The Italianate farmhouse is a two story, orange brick structure on a stone foundation, almost square in plan, with hipped roof. A one-story hip-roofed summer kitchen projects to the east (rear) and a small one-story hipped-roof room projects to the north. A two-story central bay with gable projects at the center of the west (front) side; there is a bay window on the south side. A bracketed cornice extends around the house and a wood porch is centered on the front bay. Fenestration consists of two-over-two double-hung sash in segmental arch openings with brick and keystone hoods and stone lintels, and a four-light bullseye window in the front gable. The main doors are paired in a single segmental arched opening.

The barn is a large, gable-roofed pegged-timber structure. The first level or stable area is of buff-colored stone; the upper portion is sheathed in board-andbatten siding. A gable-roofed cupola occupies a central position on the roof. A dirt ramp, which once provided drive-in access to the loft area, has been removed. There is a small lean-to addition to the north. To the southeast of the barn is a frame, gable-roofed granary. To the south and west are a frame hog house and a frame machine shed. Although the exact construction dates of these buildings have not been documented, the barn appears to be roughly contemporaneous with the house; the outbuildings were likely added somewhat later.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Christoph Krause farmstead is significant as a well-preserved group of structures representative of prosperous nineteenth century farms in rural Olmsted County. Krause, a German immigrant, settled on this site in 1861, having married Miss Julia Busian, also a German immigrant, in 1857. The Busian homestead was located directly west, across the county road, from the Krause farm and both grew and prospered together. In the 1870s each family erected a large brick house in the fashionable Italianate design. Easily visible from the road, the houses symbolized the agricultural and financial achievements of the two families. By the 1970s, one hundred years later, the Busian house had fallen into disrepair; subsequent remodeling significantly altered the exterior. The Krause farmstead, including the barn, has survived with almost total exterior integrity and is among the most complete and unaltered such farmsteads in the county.

To determine point of beginning: commencing at the southwest corner of the NW½ of section 27, thence north 321.13 ft., thence southeasterly 51.28 ft. to the east right-of-way line of County State Aid Highway 10, thence north 558.23 ft., thence west 50 ft. to the west line of the NW½. This is the point of beginning. From this point, thence north 774.40 ft., thence east 281.25 ft., thence south 774.40 ft., thence west 281.25 ft. to point of beginning. This boundary includes all of the original Krause Farmstead structures and the immediately adjacent land.
