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45. Description and House Plan:

In form, the two-story, brick, west-facing house is an I-house with a two-room ell, slightly shorter than the main block. In detailing and proportioning, the house blends the Federal and Greek Revival styles. The overall proportions and that of the front door, the jack arches in the basement openings and in the ell, and the style of the cornice all show links to Federal styling, while the use of stone lintels in the facade and, especially, the fluted Greek Doric columns at the front door, show use of Greek Revival sources.

All windows are 6/6 double-hung sash. The front porch, a likely later addition, has a replacement concrete floor. There is a mid-20th century addition constructed in brick and frame in the angle of the ell. The end chimneys in the main block are located in the interior, and the chimney in the ell is located between the two rooms of the ell.

A privy with a pyramidal roof and a shed are located to the north of the house and were erected during the period of significance and contribute to the significance of the property. .

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
