

Summary

The Quitman Home Economics Building is a Plain Traditional single-story, rectangular-plan building constructed in 1938 by the National Youth Administration. A composition-shingle gable roof with Craftsman exposed rafters shields the structural cut-stone walls and foundation. There are two interior brick chimneys and an exterior cut-stone chimney at the southern elevation.

Elaboration

The front or western elevation is dominated by projecting gable roof porch at the southern end. The porch is composed of a raised concrete deck on a cut-stone foundation and two cut-stone columns which form a segmental arch on the three sides of the porch. The columns are quoined with buff brick. The arches and the large, louvered attic vent are trimmed with buff brick in the same manner as the column quoins. Four concrete steps are located at the front of the porch while a modern handicapped-access ramp has been constructed running parallel to the north. The entrance is quoined with buff brick and features a single-leaf door, of which the upper half is lighted by nine glass panes surrounded by ten-pane sidelights and a six-pane transom. Three sets of three, six-over-six, double-hung windows light the remainder of the elevation to the north.

Five six-over-six, double-hung windows fenestrate the northern elevation. They are arranged in two sets of two with the single window located near the eastern corner. The windows and the large, louvered attic vent are trimmed with buff brick. The eastern elevation contains a shed roof covered entrance just north of center. The shed roof, an extension of the normal roofline, is supported by two ornate brackets. The single-leaf door contains a six-pane upper half and is reached by five concrete steps. The entrance is trimmed with buff brick consistent with the established pattern. Four six-over-six, double-hung windows are located south of the entrance. Two are located just under the eaves, and the other two are located side by side near the southern corner. All are trimmed with buff brick.

The southern elevation is lighted by three six-over-six, double-hung windows. Two of the buff brick-trimmed windows and the large, louvered attic vent are located west of the exterior chimney.

The building is currently in use by the Quitman School District.

Quitman Home Economics Building

As work continued on the W.P.A. construction of the new Quitman School Building, Project No. 315953 was approved in Little Rock, to "[c]onstruct a school building in the town of Quitman, Cleburne Co., and perform work appurtenant and incidental thereto." The construction of what would eventually become the Quitman School's Home Economics Building was described in the W.P.A. Central Files as "[i]n addition to projects specifically approved," in an apparent reference to the school building already under construction. A total of \$7,641 was allocated as the federal portion of the construction and labor costs, to be matched by a \$700 contribution from the Quitman School District.¹

The Quitman Home Economics Building, constructed in 1938 during the period covered by the historic context *The Evolution of the Public School System in the Arkansas Ozarks*, 1920-1940, is a representative example of a small stone school building constructed for a rural school district. Its documented construction by the W.P.A. and its use during this period as a local school building clearly identify it with this historic context and with this property type. It is significant locally under Criterion A through its direct associations with both the history of the evolution of the public school system in the Ozark Mountain region of the state during this period and the N.Y.A.

Beginning at a point formed by the intersection of a line running along the western edge of 2nd Avenue with a perpendicular line running parallel with the building's southern elevation and located 50 feet to the south thereof, proceed westerly along said line for a distance of approximately 200 feet to its intersection with a perpendicular line running parallel to the building's western elevation; thence proceed northerly along said line for a distance of approximately 200 feet to its intersection with a line running parallel to the building's northern elevation; thence proceed easterly along said line for a distance of approximately 200 feet to its intersection with a perpendicular line running along the western edge of 2nd Avenue; thence proceed southerly along said line for a distance of approximately 200 feet to the point of beginning.




