Boston Store; Granny's Country Kitchen

Location: 917 Manvel<sup>Ave</sup>, Chandler, Oklahoma, Lincoln County

Owner: Ethel Rodgers, Rt. 1, Agra, OK 74824

Description: Condition - good, altered

The building once known as the Boston Store is a two-story, rusticated sandstone structure. Presently it has a modernized lower facade with a single entrance on the right and two double windows. On the upper floor are four equally spaced, single rectangular windows. Above the windows is a sign panel. Originally the building was much more ornate in appearance with four ball-topped pinnacles along the roofline. The tops of the four cast iron columns that once supported the upper floor over a recessed entrance may still be seen within the modern front. The interior has been modernized. The building's present owners have expressed an interest in restoring the building to its original appearance.

Significance: c. 1900; Builder/Architect; Unknown

The Boston Store was one of several small ornate structures in the west 900 block of Manvel which at the turn of the century offered space for jewelers, insurance brokers, tailors, and billiards players. The Boston Store of 1907 later became the City Drugstore and is presently a restaurant.
