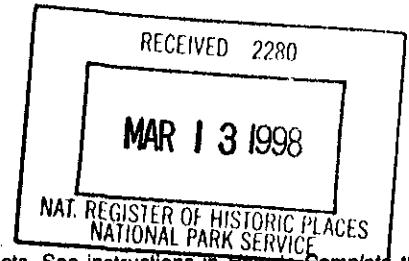

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**NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION**

The # 5 Pine Grove Voting House is situated on a large flat lot on Rock Fork Road, ½ mile north of 377. In 1897 Wyman Blanton and his wife Sarah sold the rural lot to the Rowan County Fiscal Court for \$1.00 (Deed Book 8, pp. 316-317). The original voting house was constructed of wood. Two of the stone masons who constructed the voting house were Ray and Charlie Fraley. They hauled the stone for the voting house in their wagon, (Don White Interview).

The # 5 voting house is constructed of ashlar stone with beaded mortar. Exposed beams project from the original standing seam metal roof. One over one windows are placed on the north and south elevations, with three 2' x 2' single lights located under the west gable eave. The windows have ashlar cut stone sills, but lack lintels. The three lights on the west elevation were positioned high to give light and to insure privacy to citizens voting in the three booths located under the windows. Victorian beaded boards seal the gable ends between the stone walls and roof. A capped yellow chimney is located at the center of the roof ridge.

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**NARRATIVE STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

The # 5 Pine Grove Voting House meets criterion A and is a significant physical representation of the New Deal. It was constructed by the WPA and used exclusively as a voting house during the period of significance. The # 5 Pine Grove Voting House has retained a majority of the original materials and is recognizable in function as a voting house. The # 5 Pine Grove Voting House is located in its original setting and location, and has retained its integrity of association as a building constructed by one of the New Deal era agencies.
