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Ruleville Depot Sunflower County, Mississippi

The former Illinois Central Gulf Railroad Passenger Depot, now known as the Ruleville Depot, is located at the intersection of East Floyce Street and North Front Street in downtown Ruleville. Situated directly West of the Ruleville City Park, the depot is positioned on the east side of the former Illinois Central Gulf railroad.

Built in 1930, the depot is a one-story, rectangle shaped frame building, the longer axis lies parallel to the railroad line, with the south side of the building facing East Floyce Street. The typical railroad station is surmounted by an asphalt shingle, hip roof, featuring wide overhanging eaves encased with beadboardthat extend around the entire building. The exterior walls are clad in grey asbestos shingles, below which a three foot cream colored shirt of beadboardwraps the entire building. A raised platform of wooden timbers extends the width of the building along the Northern elevation and wraps around the eastern elevation for about nineteen feet.

The fenestration of the building is irregular. The windows and doors are unevenly spaced on all elevations, and the windows are of unequal sizes, but are all still in place.

The primary facade or southern elevation consists of three windows of unequal sizes and one single-leaf door. The eastern elevation has a double-leaf loading door and one small window. Beginning at the loading door, a wooden platform of timbers extends for nineteen feet to the Northeast corner of the building with wooden steps to access the platform. The only opening on the northern elevation is the large double-leaf loading door that opens onto the loading dock or wooden platform, which extends the entire length of the northern elevation. The western elevation faces the tracks and features five windows that are unequal in size along with a double-leaf loading door. On the western side of the building stands the original wooden signal control pole, which has the manual controls on the inside of the building.

The windows have one -over-one, double hung, wooden sash and wooden sills. The Wooden double-leaf loading doors are wood without any glass visibility. The single exterior door on the southern elevation originaly had a large pane glass over two wood panels, but was replaced with a new door without any light. Each door is surmounted by a wooden transom.

The interior plan of the building consist of three major rooms with two rooms on the southern elevation that have a restroom between them. The larger room further to the north was the baggage and freight room. The interior rooms feature beadboard walls and ceiling with flush board floors. In the West room of the southern elevation, the iron control switches are above the windows on the west wall. In the east room, the east wall features a row of wooden cabinets. The restroom between the two rooms is a two fixture bath, with one door and window. The three original wooden doors on the interior still remain.

The depot was vacant for nine years from 1978 to 1987. A local manufacturing company purchased the building in 1987 and used it for storage, then donated the building in 1996 to the Ruleville Chamber of Commerce. We have the original Ruleville sign for the outside of the building, but it has not been put on the building. During the years the building was vacant, it suffered from neglect. It now has a new roof, paint on the interior and exterior, and has a new central air conditioning unit.

The tracks that ran along the depots western elevation have been removed.

The building has a few plants along the southern elevation, which is the only landscaping around the depot.

The building looks today much as it did while it was in active use as a railroad depot.

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Ruleville Depot Sunflower County, Mississippi

The former Illinois Central Gulf Railroad Depot in Ruleville is locally significant under Criterion A in the area of transportation, representing the development of growth of Ruleville as a mode of freight transportation and passenger service. The period of significance extends from 1930, when the depot was built, to 1949 (fifty years prior to the current date).

The railroad was built in 1897 from Inverness north to Ruleville by Major C. H. Pond and was known as the Yazoo Delta Railroad. The Ruleville Railroad terminal was built in 1897 and was rebuilt in 1913 after a tornado destroyed the building. The Yazoo Delta Railroad or the "Y" "D" received a nickname of "Yellow Dog", because the train would jump the track almost each trip and was always muddy with the yellow delta mud. The Ruleville Depot remained the Northern terminal until the Yazoo and Mississippi Valley System bought out the branch and extended the rails to Tutwiler. The Curious came to see the powerful "iron monster". In 1930, the Illinois Central Gulf Railroad purchased the railroad from the Yazoo and built the Ruleville railroad depot that is currently standing.

Ruleville began to flourish with the delivery of freight by rail and when passenger service was provided. This service continued with two passenger trains per day and several freight trains per day, until the 1950's when passenger service was discontinued. The freight service remained until 1978. A notice of intent to abandon or to discontinue service was published in the Enterprise-Tocin newspaper on August 31, 1978. After opposition from local citizens, the depot closed in 1978. The building remained vacant until 1987, when it was purchased by a local manufacturing company and in 1996, the building was donated to the Ruleville Chamber of Commerce.

Verbal Boundary Description

The boundary of the nominated property consists of a rectangle, the center of which is located at the roof ridge, measuring 32½ feet to the North and South from the center of roof ridge, and 20 feet to the east and west of roof ridge. The resulting rectangle of land has sides that are 65 feet and 40 feet wide that run parallel or perpendicular to the ridge of the roof. The property is located in the southwest quarter of Section 31, Township 22 North, Range 3 west of the Choctaw Meridian at Ruleville.

Boundary Justification

The nominated property includes the historic Ruleville Depot and its immediate setting.

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
