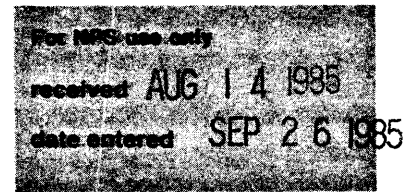

4. Owner: Steven Blocher, 1406 Romero, Las Vegas, N.M.
7. Description: Stuccoed foundation; stuccoed adobe walls; wood shingles on roof and gables, door in gable; 2/2 double-hung windows with board surrounds; single door; boxed porch posts with lattice. Located in residential area two blocks west of the Old Town Residential District.
8. Significance: An unaltered, classic example of the New Mexico Vernacular type of about 1895. The basic linear plan takes a rear facing L-shape. (The end of the rear arm is barely visible to the right in ill. 68.) A window/door/window group with white trim is adopted from the Territorial Style; while an impressive cap is formed by the wood shingled roof (with an uncharacteristic hipped corner). The typical gable door leads to the food drying attic atop the original (?) flat earthen roof.

Boundary: Lot 2 of Block 67 of the Addition to the Town of Las Vegas.
