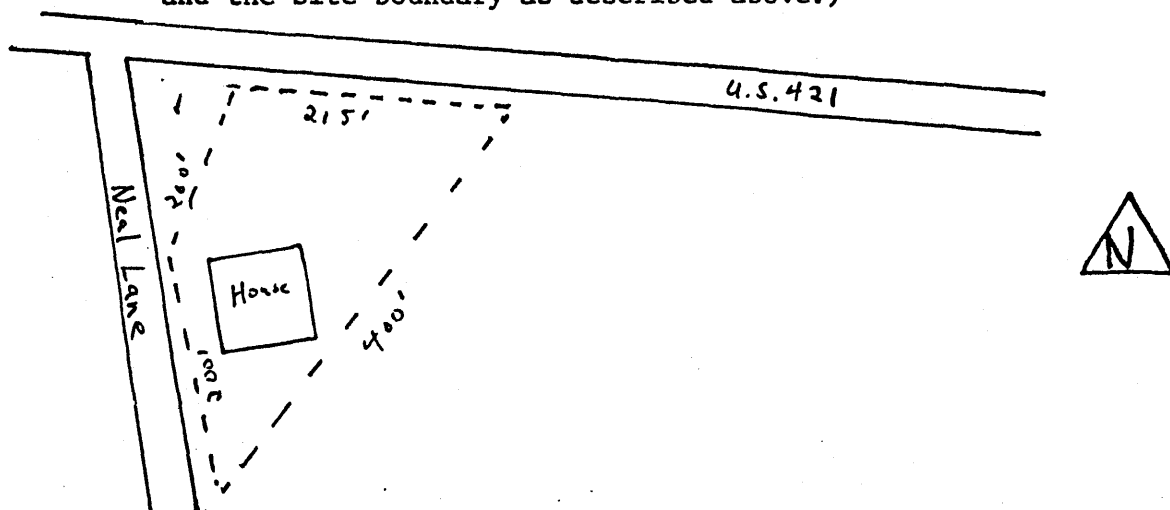

Beginning at a point on the south side of U.S. 421 approximately 185' from the center of the house, proceed 215' in a southeastward direction along U.S. 421; thence 400' in a southwestward direction; thence 200' in a northwestward direction; thence 260' in a north-eastward direction to the point of origin.
