DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The subject home was constructed at the turn of the century by Charles Bibby, one of the founders of the City of Oceanside. The architectural style selected for the building was Victorian as shown in the enclosed photo exhibits.

Careful investigation of the roof and floor plans hint at a deliberate attempt by the architect (unknown) to duplicate the European cathedral layout -- namely the "cross" plan.

Situated on a ridge line, the building possessed an unobstructed view of the ocean until the downtown section of Oceanside was built on said land. The access to the property was via a trail from Mission Avenue which connects the downtown area with the famed Mission San Luis Rey.

CONSTRUCTION

Materials used for construction were wood framing, lath and plaster interiors, and horizontal cedar sidings on the exterior. Exterior trim pieces were skillfully carved to fit at joints around the bay window and porches. The ceilings are 10' high on both levels. Roofs are steep and covered with wood shakes. Double hung windows were used. Porches and bay window contained tapered columns with bases and caps.

The building has two brick chimneys, both in poor condition; one serves a fireplace located at the original dining room; the other served the pot belly stove in the kitchen. The latter chimney is uniquely located on top of a thick wood cabinet used from the first floor bathroom.

The interior contains wood floors, eight inch wide stained base board, and four inch wide stained wood jambs around all doors. In addition, a wood picture rack trim (moulding) is mounted horizontally in each room approximately 8' high. There are 10 rooms in the house, a cast iron bathtub, circular staircase, and a functional entry bell. The electric light switches cover plates are solid brass.

EFFECT OF MOVE

The Charles Libby building was scheduled to be demolished at the end of July, 1977 by the previous owner in order to prepare the site for an office and apartment complex. Similar buildings in the area have been destroyed in the past few years to allow for the construction of a shopping center and Freeway I-5. The Charles Libby House is the last of its kind in Oceanside.

The Present owner relocated the building to a nearby site on August 4, 1977 (with the support and cooperation of the Oceanside City Council, the local members of the Historic Society, and the utility companies.)

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Charles Libby House, built sometime between 1902 and 1905 by Charles Libby, one of Oceanside's founders, remains as the best example of late Victorian/Colonial Revival architecture in Oceanside. Libby, a local real estate broker and city councilman, built the house on a prominent ridge overlooking the Pacific Ocean to attract others to the city. In the 1920's, the house was purchased by Goldie Rush -- a burlesque queen and performer who occupied the building until her death in 1968. Goldie was noted for collecting furniture which was sold upon her death. In addition, she was known to raise prize chickens and preserve fruits and vegetables. Approximately 1000 antique glass jars are still kept in the house.

Although the building has been moved, its new location approximates the old in size and topography. The house was relocated in 1977 to save it from demolition and the relocation received the full support of the City Council and local citizens. The building is basically unaltered and restoration will return it to its original condition.

The Charles Libby House is both architecturally and historically significant. In spite of the fact that it has been relocated, it represents one of Oceanside's last tangible links to its early development, and remains the city's finest example of late Victorian/Colonial Revival architecture.


The new site is located approximately 1/2 mile south, on the same topographic ridgeline, possessing panoramic view of the mountains to the east and limited view of the ocean to the west.

The site is comparable to the original site in size and is more readily visible and accessible to travellers from I-5. The zoning of the present site (R-1) insures its permanence. An effort is being made by the present owner to reconstruct the facade of the original garage (stables) and to relocate portions of the original landscaping.

The move had been supported by the community.
