- 3. 12-story, 3-bay wood-framed building, with a pitched gable roof.
- 4. large T-shaped brick building, extensively altered. One pavilion (warehouse), 20 bays long, is 2 stories and has a flat roof and parapet. Perpendicular to this pavilion, and extending eastward from it, is a larger, 1-story pavilion (heavy forging and machine shop) with a steep, pitched gable and monitor roof. Both pavilions have steel truss roofs and steel concrete superstructures, corbeled cornices and brick piers along each elevation. Most original 12/12 wood sash windows have been covered up with cinder blocks. Smaller brick and cinder block pavilions project from the main pavilions.
