DISCUSSION AS REQUIRED:

when he organized Arizona's first miners' union and became the union's first president. In 1914, he was elected to the Arizona House of Representatives and, in 1916, to the State Senate. He was a sponsor of measures dealing with minimum wages for women and workmen's compensation. From 1918 to 1926, he was Sheriff of Mohave County, after which he left Kingman but continued to serve in public offices until his death in 1967. Mahoney lived in this house from 1919 until 1927.
