19. History <u>Clinkenbeard was at Strode Station and moved out about the same time as Goff, who built on Van Meter Road around 1808.</u> <u>"JWP" one of three houses labeled this way apparently owned by J. W. Prewitt 1280a Breeder of shorthorns.</u>			
20. Significance <u>This exceptional hall-parlor plan house has excellent Federal detailing and is most certainly a survivor from the late eighteenth century. It was constructed by William Clinkenbeard on property which was patented out of Strode's Station. Soon after its initial construction, a one-story brick wing was added.</u>
