use at 240 South Cortez is a large two-and-a-half-story wood shingle mansard. In plan the building measures approximately 40 by 60 feet. The roof is complex, combining hip, gable, and conical elements. The house features a corner tower, bay windows, and dormers. Clapboard is used on the first and second stories; shingles are used in the gable ends. Characteristic of the Queen Anne style, the house has a string course or an ornate frieze above the windows on the second story. Recently installed aluminum siding; however, the integrity of the house is still intact.
