


Physical Description

This attractive and formal two-story house is beautifully situated on a well-landscaped and tree-shaded terraced lot imposingly elevated above the sidewalk. A long brick sidewalk and two ranges of steps provide a dignified access from the street. The structure is faced with brick and capped by a low hipped tile roof. It represents a somewhat elongated version of the firm's similar popular design of a three bay two-story house with low hipped roof, for here the front elevation features four bays below and five above in an asymmetrical arrangement of openings on the two-stories. A long, open porte-cochere supported by plain brick piers extends on the east elevation. Simple details characterize the design. The single leaf front door is simply but effectively framed and accentuated by two Tuscan columns supporting a full unembellished entablature crowned by a paneled parapet creating a balcony effect. Two small windows above framed with shutters complete this central focus. The first-floor windows are groups of multi-paned casements. Above, the sash windows are paired and have six-overone lights.

Statement of Significance

The Lightle House in Searcy, Arkansas was designed by the Thompson and Harding firm in 1923. An important residence in the city, the Lightle House presents an impressive Colonial Revival image. Located on a major thoroughfare in Searcy which has experienced commercial development in the past few years, the Lightle House rests on an oversized tree-shaded lot. The house is a slightly more elongated version of the firm's 1920's Colonial Revival influenced residences. The Lightle House presents a formal and dignified appearance without the monumental size and prominent portico which marked many Colonial Revival styled homes. Simple but handsomely detailed, the two-story red brick Lightle House is one of Searcy's most attractive early-twentieth century residences.
