Narrative Description:

The Crystal Bridge is located on a paved, single-lane county road in Pembina County, North Dakota. The site is located at the western edge of the small community of Crystal. The bridge, constructed on an approximate east-west axis, carries Appleton Avenue, leading from Crystal to a rural portion of the county; although undocumented, this may have been an early alignment of North Dakota Highway 66 through the area. The surrounding land is heavily cultivated, and scattered groups of farmstead buildings exist in the vicinity. A residential neighborhood of Crystal is immediately east of the structure. The bridge crosses Cart Creek, a primary watercourse in the area. Here, the creek meanders through a narrow, shallow valley dotted with trees and wetlands.

The bridge itself is a two-span concrete T-beam structure, some 66 feet long. Concrete T-beam designs saw occasional use in North Dakota during the first half of the twentieth century, as bridge builders began experimenting with the increased use of reinforced concrete in heavy load-bearing applications. Unlike steel truss designs, most small concrete bridges of the era utilized standardized plans prepared by federal or state structural engineers. Concrete Tbeam bridges were relatively uncommon in most parts of North Dakota.

Design details of the bridge's substructure and superstructure are outlined below:

Structure type: 2-span, concrete T-beam

Dimensions: 66 feet long, 25 feet wide overall

Substructure: concrete abutments with wingwalls; post-and-lintel concrete piers

Superstructure:

floor system: 5 concrete T-beams; 8 drains on each side decking: concrete covered with asphalt; sidewalk on south side railing: 2 horizontal metal pipes with posts extending across the top of the wingwalls; single horizontal metal pipe railing separating the sidewalk and street

The bridge retains a very high level of integrity; it remains in its original location, and all major structural components appear to retain their asbuilt appearance. Some spalling of the concrete has taken place.

The Crystal Bridge is owned and maintained by Pembina County. It carries the state numerical designation 34-113-29.2.

Narrative Statement of Significance:

In accordance with the guidelines established in the Multiple Property Documentation form for "Historic Roadway Bridges in North Dakota," the Crystal Bridge is eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places with local significance under Criteria "A" and "C." The bridge is significant under Criterion A for its association for the development and improvement of North Dakota's rural roadway network. It is eligible under Criterion C because the date of construction and builder have been firmly documented and because it is one of two of the oldest documented concrete T-beams in North Dakota.

<u>Historical information</u>: According to the county records, the \$4,187 contract for this concrete T-beam bridge was awarded to the Fargo Bridge and Iron Company on December 20, 1927. At the same meeting, the citizens of Crystal City presented a petition requesting that a reinforced concrete railing be substituted for the metal railing specified on the original plan. The Commissioners laid the matter over until the January meeting to give them time to confer with an engineer from the Fargo Bridge and Iron Company. At the January meeting, they decided to adhere to the "standard federal plans" and made no change to the railing.

The bridge is located in the Northeast quarter of Section 13, Township 159 North, Range 55 West. The boundary consists of a rectangle, measuring 116 feet east-west and 75 feet north-south, and centered on the bridge superstructure.

Boundary Justification:

The boundary is constructed to include the area occupied by the bridge superstructure and substructure, as well as a 25-foot buffer of land immediately surrounding the structure.
